Florida State Foster/Adoptive Parent Association, along with other state and national agencies and organizations, recognizes November as National Adoption Awareness Month.

If you've ever considered adopting from foster care but didn't know where to get information, take a look at the Explore Adoption website at www.adoptflorida.org. Explore Adoption is a statewide adoption initiative that promotes the benefits of public adoption and urges families to consider creating or expanding their families by adopting a child who is older, disabled or part of a sibling group.

There are 850 children available for adoption on any given day in Florida. With the help of the Florida Department of Children and Families, community-based care agencies and other partners, more than 12,000 children in foster care have found Forever Families over the past three



and a half years.

Worried you might not be "perfect" for adoption? Remember, there are no perfect families or children. The most important things to have are patience, a good sense of humor, a love of children and the commitment to be a good parent.
