The Florida State Foster / Adoptive Parent Association (FSFAPA) is a statewide membership group for all foster and adoptive parents in Florida. All foster and adoptive parents are automatically members of FSFAPA.

Supporting our families

FSFAPA hosts four quarterly meetings each year to provide training and support for our families. As a state association, we are cognizant of our parents' limited schedules and travel abilities, therefore we schedule the meetings in different parts of the state to ensure everyone has a chance to participate. FSFAPA also hosts monthly conference calls that gives parents access to Department of Children and Families news, FSFAPA events and child welfare

speakers, as well as a forum for networking with other parents.

Advocating for our families

A big part of our organization is the Foster Allegation Support Team (F.A.S.T.). A FAST coordinator is on hand to provide support to the foster parent when an allegation has been brought against him or her.

FSFAPA strongly believes that it is important to keep foster parents informed of the procedures and the process through which an allegation will take them. FSFAPA maintains a hotline (800.FAST.119) that's available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Parents can also contact FAST through fast@floridafapa.org.
